

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

Skipper has the idea

ATV Manufacturing Limited, Toronto, Canada, has announced a new promotion scheme entitled "Total Promotion" to assist dealers in selling their Skipper All Terrain Vehicle.

W. M. Nobbs, president of the company and designer of the Skipper said that his company has realized the need for dealer assistance since the introduction of the Skipper over a year ago. Said Nobbs, "We have been working on a total promotion package for some time now and feel this is the kind of boost that all ATV dealers need to sell in this tight economy."

Nobbs, a professional engineer and business school graduate himself, decided to hire a marketing professional to round out the team.

Stewart Kinsman, newly appointed marketing manager for ATV Manufacturing, after an extensive tour of the U.S. and Canadian markets summed up the problem in three words, "Dealers need help."

Kinsman went on to elaborate that ATVs may be well understood by the manufacturers who live them day-in and day-out, but to a dealer they represent a hard-sell, high-ticket item that is not understood by the public. The problem is amplified with dealers who sell other faster-moving bread and butter lines such as snowmobiles, farm equipment, cars, etc. To these people the relatively slow rate of sale of an ATV is discouraging, especially when few of them know how to correct the problem.

"Outdoor signs and showroom banners are fine," said Kinsman, "but they don't help a dealer close sales."

The Skipper "Total Promotion Package" is made up of the following components:

- a) Dealer marketing aids.
- b) Advertising allowance.
- c) Dealer service manual.
- d) Owner manual and tool kit.
- e) Regular service bulletins.
- f) Monthly Dealer Newsletter.

The dealer marketing aids are designed to make the dealer a confident and professional marketer of the Skipper. The main piece is a booklet describing ways to publicize, advertise, sell, demonstrate and promote the Skipper.

Another integral part of the marketing aids is the literature. Kinsman said that his company has produced the most attractive and convincing literature in the industry, "because we feel that ATV purchases

are based as much on emotion as on logic. Our literature makes a person want to own a Skipper so that he can be part of the in-crowd," said Kinsman.

A second part of the Skipper "Total Promotion Package" scheme is an advertising allowance which helps defray the cost of much-needed publicity.

Nobbs told NATVA that the manufacturer cannot stop at providing promotion and sales ideas. "That is the reason," said Nobbs, "that we offer a complete and comprehensive Dealer Service Manual to our dealers. If a man can read, he can virtually build a Skipper from the ground up by following the step-by-step instructions and diagrams in our Service Manual." To keep the manual current, the company registers each one with the dealer and maintains an updating operation where new pages are sent out to the dealer as parts or prices change. "As well," said Nobbs, "we send each manual holder periodic service bulletins as we find ways to improve the performance of the Skipper."



To ensure that the retail customer is also familiar with the handling and normal maintenance of his vehicle, the company provides an Owner's Manual and a small tool kit with each new Skipper.

Kinsman mails a monthly newsletter to all dealers to keep them abreast of model changes, sales successes, and rally results. "In this way," said Kinsman, "our dealers know there is an interested and capable manufacturing operation backing them up."

Does this "Total Promotion Package" work? Company officials report that the first dealer who followed the plan in detail held an open house which generated profits through the sale of Skippers of \$2,400 in one week. Total promotion investment was less than the margin generated through the sale of one Skipper.

La. Sports Show April 16, 17 & 18 expects large turnout

Recreational vehicles will be featured during a major sports and recreation show, to be held in Louisiana next spring, according to an announcement made by the Alexandria-Rapides Conventions Commission. Commission Director Richard Marcantel said the event will be the annual Louisiana Sports Show. to be held April 16, 17, and 18, in the Rapides Coliseum in Alexandria.

Marcantel noted that Alexandria was selected as the site for the show for several reasons. He said the modern Rapides Coliseum is one of the newest exposition facilities in the state. and is strategically located in the center of Louisiana. Marcantel also noted that central Louisiana is the heart of one

of the south's fastest growing sports and recreation areas. He noted that millions of dollars are being spent in the area each year for recreational facilities. Among them, Marcantel said, is the giant Toledo Bend Lake, which is the world's largest man-made lake.

Recreational vehicles, including mini-bikes, trail bikes, and the exciting new all terrain vehicles, will be featured during the Louisiana Sports Show. Also receiving special emphasis will be the popular camper and camping equipment products.

Vehicles are playing a more important role in outdoor activity in the south, and the Louisiana Sports Show is being planned with these products and their market in mind. The show will open with a parade of recreational vehicles, and there will also be a special outside demonstration area. adjacent to the coliseum.





TROUBLE SHOOTING

Here are some trouble shooting procedures for Amphicat. Suggestions for determining cause of malfunctions are outlined. Being able to locate the cause of trouble in an improperly operating Amphicat is as important as being able to correct this problems.

Technicians should avail themselves of every opportunity to throughly familiarize themselves with Amphicat's operating systems and mechanical make-up so they can then take a systematic approach to trouble shooting.

STARTING-ELECTRIC STARTER

1. Starter cranks too slowly.

- a. Weak battery.
- b. Loose or corroded connections.
- c. Starter faulty.
- d. Engine run without oil-gas mixture.
- 2. Starter will not crank engine.
 - a. Dead battery.
 - b. Faulty starter switch.
 - c. Wire connections loose or broken.
 - d. Starter wiring system not grounded.
 - e. Engine frozen.

RUNNING-LOW SPEED ONLY


- I. Low speed miss.
 - a. Incorrect gas-oil mixture.
 - b. Carburetor idle adjustment too lean or too rich.
 - c. Spark plugs improperly gapped, dirty or broken.
 - d. Loose or broken ignition wires.
 - e. Spark plug terminal loose.
 - f. Weak coil or condenser.
 - g. Breaker points burned, dirty or improperly gapped.
 - h. Cylinder gasket.
 - i. Leaking crankcase seals.



New 649.5cc Hirth Red Baron



The "Red Baron", a compact, free-air design 649.5 cc, two-cycle in-line twin engine specifically designed for snowmobile racing, has been announced by Hirth Motoren KG, of West Germany.

Rated 60 horsepower at 6500 rpm, the new Model 172R41 will be available for 1971 competition through Teledyne Wisconsin Motor of Milwaukee, sales and service representative for Hirth engines.

Racing design features of the new model include large ports, tuned exhause and a choice of racing carburetors.

The "Red Baron" incorporates a special full-webbing, full-circle forged steel crankshaft which provides full induction for greater compression and more power. It is equipped with chrome bore cylinders and aluminum heads and has a 78 mm bore and 68 mm storke.

The engine's free-air cooling eliminates the fan and other conventional cooling hardware, thus providing a lightweight (65 pounds), space-saving, compact engine. The "Red Baron" is available with rope start only, and has no provision for either recoil or electric start.



automatically as the engine speeds up.

No lubrication is required either; in fact, take care not to allow oil on the pulleys or belt. After 60 hours of operation, or about six months, check the belt for wear by measuring its width. Proper width is 1-3/16 inches. If the belt has worn to less than 1-1/8 inches, it should be replaced. Save the old belt for a spare.

After 200 hours of operation, or a couple of years, you'd be wise to have your dealer dismantle the torque converter to check for any parts that appear excessively worn; they should be replaced.

KOHLER ENGINE IGNITION

With the exception of spark plugs, repair or replacement of ignition system components should be done only by qualified Kohler Engine Specialists as this usually involves retiming the engine.

SPARK PLUG: Remove spark plug and check condition — replace if carbon fouled or if porcelain is cracked. The color of the spark plug is a good indicator of operating condition. Take corrective action if other than normal operation is indicated. — Black: carbon fouling, Tan: normal, White: overheating.

Do not sandblast, scrape or otherwise attempt to service plug that is in poor condition — best results are obtained with a new plug. Bosch Standard Duty plug: M 240 T1; Heavy Duty: M 280 T1. Champion Standard Duty: K9 or K8G; Heavy Duty: K7. Standard plugs are suitable for average operation including occasional runs at full throttle, heavy load. Heavy duty plugs are for pulling through heavy, wet snow and/or warm weather. Use these plugs listed only.


